

UNIFORM

POLICY

Rationale:

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the uniform policy.

Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

- A uniform policy has been developed that we believe provides choice for the students, allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial constraints of families.
- The uniform policy applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Summer and winter uniforms, as well as sports uniforms will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- There is a summer and winter uniform. Both may be worn all year, but should not be mixed.
- No coloured undershirts/ T shirts may be worn
- Only the official school jacket may be worn. These may only be worn outside
- Students are encouraged to wear hats but should only be worn outside.
- All items of school uniform are expected to be kept and worn in a presentable manner. Skirts should be of a respectable length. Students wearing uniform in an unacceptable fashion will be considered to be out of uniform.
- If a student is out of uniform for any reason they should report to the sub school office prior to the first class of the day. Where possible, a replacement article will be provided. Where this is not possible, a uniform pass will be provided. This should be carried all day by the student and presented upon request.
- School Council requires the Principal be responsible for implementation of the uniform policy in a manner consistent with the Student Code of Conduct.
- Arrangements can be made to supply uniforms via State Schools Relief for families experiencing economic hardship.

Polo shirt	KSC logo white or royal blue polo shirt. Only available from KSC Uniform shop
Windcheater Years 7-9	V neck navy blue windcheater with KSC logo. Only available from KSC Uniform shop
Windcheater Years 10-12	VCE windcheater – navy with KSC logo.
Boys pants	Tailored or loose fit navy pants. Academy style. Pants should be neatly hemmed. Available from Uniform shop.
Girls pants	Tailored, fashionable cut, stretch navy pants. Pants should be neatly hemmed. Available from Uniform shop
Shorts	Tailored or loose fit navy shorts. Academy style. Available at KSC Uniform shop
Summer and winter skirts	KSC summer fabric skirt or kilt in KSC winter fabric. Only available at KSC Uniform shop
Summer dress	Lightweight dress in KSC summer fabric. Only available from KSC Uniform shop
Socks	White plain or sports socks. Socks are compulsory with closed shoes. Black socks may be worn only with long pants.
Shoes	Black leather school shoes – lace up or buckle. Sandals or runners of any type are not permitted.
Tights	Navy blue tights are an alternative to socks. Only to be worn with winter uniform.
Scarf	Nave blue scarf only. Available at Uniform shop
Sports uniform	The sports uniform is compulsory for students in years 7-10. It consists of black track pants or KSC logo navy shorts with KSC logo royal blue & navy sports polo top. This is the change of clothes that students must bring for Physical Education classes.
Jacket	KSC jackets only allowed. To be worn outdoors only. Available from KSC Uniform shop.
